



### instructions:

**1** Use one of the 840 built-in designs to create the patterns for the mobile strings. (m1-m2). Choose a minimum of 4 designs. Play with the size and width of the designs on the screen of the Scan N Cut according to your own preference.

**2** Duplicate the designs you would like to cut, so that it fits economically onto the paper you are going to use. Allow to cut enough designs as you will glue two designs on top of one another with the ribbon of the mobile strings in-between the designs. This will form the strings hanging down.

**3** Cut the patterns with the Scan N Cut. (m3-m4)

**4** After cutting all the designs, pack them in rows according to the way you would like the strings of the mobile to hang. Alternate the designs to form an interesting pattern. (m5)

**5** Fold the patterns in half to ensure you glue the designs onto the ribbon exactly in the middle of the design. If not, the images will lean over to the heavier side and will not hang evenly. (m6)

**6** Glue two identical designs together with thin ribbon in the middle. Glue designs at equal intervals in between. This will form the dangles of the mobile. (m7-m9). Allow to dry completely before handling.

**7** Measure the distance from the ceiling to where the

hoop will hang. Cut 4 pieces of ribbon of the same length. Tie them to the hoop and gather them together and tie a knot. Trim any excess ribbon.

**8** After the glue has dried, open each of the designs and fold them towards the middle to allow them to move freely. (m9)

**9** Use wire and form a hoop around a tin according to the size you desire. Close the wire at the ends to form a perfect circle and tie the ribbons, which was cut in short pieces, around the wire. (m10)

**10** Ensure that you tie enough ribbons close enough to each other to completely cover the wire hoop. (m11)
